## Parks and Trees

- A group of ten Americorp members have been working with the Parks and Trees Department for the last two weeks. During this time, they have helped pull close to 1700 woody invasive shrubs (many of them very large) using picks, shovels, come-a-longs and the Park tractor, as well as a lot of sweat equity!
- Additionally they have helped plant over 450 trees to help limit the spread of invasives, shrink the area the invasives occupy, and improve the riparian habitat mostly in the North Branch River Park along the bike path as well. 5:00 pm to 12:00 am (Midnight)

Please note there will be a detour in effect at the roundabout on Main Street in Montpelier, Sunday night (5/14) between 5:00 pm and 12:00 am (Midnight). See details below.

Sunday Night (5/14) – Milling will start on Spring Street at the beginning of the work shift and continue through the roundabout and onto Main Street ending School Street.

**Roundabout Detour** - Due to the constrained working area in the roundabout area, while work is occurring from School Street to the Roundabout, passenger vehicles wanting to use the roundabout will be directed to an alternate route marked with signs. This same detour will be in place when this section is paved.

- Main St [north / south] Passenger vehicles will be directed to use School Street and Loomis
  Street
- Trucks (tractor units) will <u>not</u> be directed to use the School Street/Loomis Street detour to access County Road and/or Main Street. They will be held at the roundabout until equipment is cleared and then directed through.
- Trucks (tractor units) on Main Street wanting to access VT 12/Elm Street will be directed to use School Street to Elm Street.
- Local traffic will have access to all businesses and/or residents between School Street and the roundabout while the detour is in use.

Traffic control devices will be in place to direct motorists. Flaggers and Uniformed Traffic Officers will also be present to assist with traffic.
