#### WEEKLY REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS ...

#### **Public Works**

Water & Sewer Division:

Harrison Ave. project continues with the installation of the new water main. Although better progress is being made, production is repeatedly impacted by various conflicts with the storm system and house services. The project is currently behind schedule and the engineering staff has recommended we retain the assistance of a private contractor to begin work on the new sewer main. This will allow the DPW crew to continue work on the water main and house services while a second crew is working consecutively which we expect to begin the first or second week of September.

#### Street Division:

Project highlights for the week of August 14th:

- Completion of the Sibley Avenue sidewalk project
- Ditching and restoration work on Gallison Hill Road
- Begin reconstruction work on upper Winter Street to prepare for paving

"Makeover Montpelier" Project (State & Main paving & sidewalk reconstruction):

The work is wrapping up in the downtown area with some signs remaining to be installed and punch list items to be addressed. The contractor now plans to begin work on the Elm Street phase of the project. See the update provided by FRP Enterprises.

Annual Street Paving & Sidewalk Contracts:

The City's contractor, Engineers Construction has provided a preliminary schedule for the work this summer. The selected 1,300' long segment of Gallison Hill Road was milled and paving completed on Friday, August 11th. For the week of August 14th, their concrete sidewalk crew will be working on Governor Davis Avenue and replacing one crosswalk ramp on High School Drive. When complete, the crew will begin work on replacing several sidewalk ramps in the vicinity of the Vermont College of Fine Arts. These ramps are non-compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act and must be reconstructed to properly accommodate incoming students at the college. The plan for the week of August 21st includes paving of High School Drive, Governor Davis Ave and beginning the pavement reclamation work on Winter Street.

# Finance Department

The first installment of the 2017-2018 property taxes is due Tuesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Payments may be made via mail, in person in the clerk's office between 8 am and 4:30 pm or 24 hours per day/7 days per week using the drop box located to the left of the rear entrance to City Hall. Online payments are also available via the city's website at www.montpelier-vt.org and selecting the online payments icon. The link will bring you to the city's payment processor, Official Payments. A convenience fee does apply for online payments.

You may also elect to sign up for automatic payment of your property tax and/or water/sewer bills. An insert was included with the water/sewer bills that were mailed on July 31<sup>st</sup>. Automatic payments are simple to set up, offered for free and processed on the due date of each installment.
