Parks and Tree Report

Staff worked with Tree Board Members and Brian Tuttle and the DPW Street Crew to pull out tree grates and concrete slabs around two downtown trees. Cracks and frost heaves had created trip hazards. In fixing two problems at once, soil in some areas is also being replaced with "structural soil", a patented mix of aggregates and soil components which is supposed to work very well under sidewalks. It also has large stones that not only provide structural support, they also provide air space and waterholding capacity that better support from healthy growth of downtown trees.

Planning stages are underway for Earth Day, Arbor Day and Green-Up Day activities ... all are coming up soon!

April 29th: Part of the Montpelier High School boys' soccer team will be helping

with trail restoration work in Hubbard Park.

May 5th: Arbor Day ... the Montpelier High School boys' soccer team, some Tree Board Members, a NCCC group, and other community volunteers will help remove invasive plants; plant numerous trees in the North Branch River Park; and care for the Tree Nursery.

May 6th: Green-Up Day community volunteers will get a chance to work with the NCCC group and park staff removing invasives, planting native plants, picking up litter and sprucing up our parks.

Our Americorp member provided key assistance in writing and getting a \$8,700 grant from the State Department of Environmental Conservation. This grant will help in a major phase of our efforts to control invasives and improve the riparian buffer and watershed of the North Branch River Park. First, wood invasives will be pulled and money from the grant will purchase native stock to displace the removed invasives, helping assure invasives will not return and bringing back species that improve diversity, provide more benefits to people and wildlife. Secondly, native plant "buffers" (rows of dense evergreens) will be planted to reduce the chances of knotweed spreading further along the riverbanks in the North Branch River Park. After we control the spread, then we will refocus similar efforts to reduce this invasive plant that is destructive and destabilizing to our local riverbanks and habitat.

Parks and Trees also received a "grant" of a nine-person Americorp crew, NCCC, for the month of May. This crew's main focus will be to help with the project mentioned above, as well as helping with trail improvements. The crew is comprised of nine college-age Americorp members, mostly from the Maryland area.

DPW Timeout for Safety Training:

The DPW employees in the Streets and Water/Sewer Divisions will take a time out for two and a half days of operations and construction-related safety training from Wednesday the 26th through Friday the 28th.

On the afternoon of the 26th, the crews will receive awareness and orientation training concerning work place hazards to include a course on "lock out/tag out" to prevent injuries related to exposure to active and stored energy; a course about "hazard communications" involving chemicals, etc.; and "confined space entry" requirements and procedures.

On the 27th and 28th, the crew will receive classroom and hands-on training and gain experience at a trench/excavation workshop which will be presented through the Vermont Local Roads Program. The crews will receive instruction about trenching hazards and VOSHA required safety procedures and methods which will consist of an actual excavation site, and provide information to enable employees to evaluate and identify stable and unstable soils, atmospheric hazards, fall prevention methods, sloping techniques, and confined space recognition. Due to the importance of proper work place safety practices, the DPW crews will only perform essential maintenance operations during this time unless there is an emergency.

Announcement: Downtown Tree Care

April 18, 2017

Beginning this week, Public Works crews will be working on a project to improve conditions for downtown trees. We are working with the Tree Board and Tree Warden to supplement the soils for 6 tree-planting pits on Main Street. This work consists of removing existing soils around the pits and replacing the material with a structural soil designed by Cornell University for use in urban settings that promotes and enhances root growth while providing structural support for sidewalks and other paved surfaces. This soil was used for State Street trees several years ago, and tree health there has improved. This work has been coordinated with the planned sidewalk reconstruction project that will be taking place this summer. Sidewalk sections removed for the tree project will be replaced by the paving contractor.
